

INFORMATION AND ADVICE NOTE TO RECEPTION STAFF - SEAFARER MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS

This advice note is intended to provide supporting information to reception staff making arrangements for the examination of seafarers on behalf of the MCA appointed approved doctor.

AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE APPOINTMENT, THE SEAFARER SHOULD BE GIVEN THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- · the location and the length of the appointment;
- the fee charged, responsibilities for payment, including the consequences of failing to attend;
- to avoid exposure to loud noise for 16 hours before the appointment if audiometry is being carried out:
- it is advisable to have a dental checkup before attending for their ENG1 medical, if they have not had one in the last year;
- to remove any contact lenses before their appointment so that their eyes are settled for their unaided visual acuity test.

The seafarer should bring along;

- previous ENG1 Medical Certificate; unless new entrant.
- form of photo identification e.g. Passport / Discharge Book or other certified photographic proof of identity e.g. Company Pass.
- glasses or contact lenses if worn, plus spares
- any medication, recent letters, discharge notes, sight test results etc. which relate to medical treatment since the last medical.

LOST OR STOLEN CERTIFICATES

If a seafarer, previously examined by an Approved Doctor reports the loss, theft or destruction of a current certificate and explains the circumstances in writing, it is for the Approved Doctor to use his / her judgement in deciding whether to:

- re-examine the seafarer and issue a new certificate valid from the date of examination; or
- b) issue a new certificate bearing the exact details of the missing certificate* (based on the duplicate pad copy of the ENG1), and clearly marked 'duplicate'.

An administrative fee may be charged for the issue of a replacement certificate, but it is expected that the full fee will be charged only when a full ENG1 examination is undertaken.

Please Note: Duplicate certificates may only be issued to replace those certificates issued by the same Doctor, so an Approved Doctor may not issue a duplicate certificate that was previously issued by another Approved Doctor.

The statutory fee for a seafarer medical examination is published on the MCA website. VAT is **not** chargeable.
